Notice to Contributors

Papers for publication should be sent to the Editors, *Archives of Disease in Childhood*, B.M.A. House, Tavistock Square, London W.C.1. Submission of a paper will be held to imply that it contains original work which has not been previously published. Permission to republish must be obtained from the Editors.

Short reports. Case reports, brief laboratory observations, preliminary communications, and other short papers may be submitted for this section. Length must not exceed two printed pages of the *Archives*, i.e. in general not more than 1000 words of text, two figures or tables, and eight references. Single case reports will usually only be considered in this form.

For guidance on ethical aspects authors should refer to an Editorial in this journal (1967, 42, 109).

One galley proof will be sent to the author submitting the paper.

Reprints. Fifty reprints are supplied free and further reprints may be ordered when the proof is returned.

Authors should check the following requirements before submitting a paper:

- (1) Scripts to be typed in double spacing.
- (2) Metric system to be used; temperature in Centigrade.
- (3) Institution(s) where work done to be stated.
- (4) Address of author(s), if other than above, to be given as footnote.
- (5) Name and address of author supplying reprints to be given at end of paper.
- (6) Figures: (a) provided with a caption, typed on a separate sheet, (b) referred to in the text.
- (7) Diagrams to be drawn on stout white paper; any lettering may be lightly inserted in pencil.
- (8) Photographs to be on glossy paper, unmounted, and trimmed to include only relevant portion. Any lettering, etc. to be inserted should be indicated on a separate transparent sheet.
- (9) Coloured illustrations may be considered, but the author will usually be asked to contribute to the cost.

(10) Tables (numbered in Roman numerals) to be provided with a title.

(11) References in the text to conform precisely to the style current in the *Archives*. Papers with one or two authors: name author(s) on each occasion the paper is cited. Papers with three authors: name all three when paper is first cited; use—*et al.* in subsequent citations. Papers with more than three authors: use—*et al.* in each citation.

(12) References to be listed alphabetically with full title of article or book; title of journal to be given in full.

(13) Summary to be typed on a separate sheet, and confined to what was done, and what was concluded.

on human development, to physical growth and development, to socialization, to cognition and learning, to adolescence, to the urban environment, and to the import of institutions, economics, and the law upon human development.'

One has the impression that had one been present and heard some of the addresses, these might have possessed an inspirational quality, which must have evaporated with the translation into cold print. As it is,

the very general terms in which most speakers framed their contributions mitigated against their making much impact in the present publication.

For the paediatrician, the section of Physical and Chemical Growth and Development is perhaps likely to prove the most interesting, giving him an idea of the light that can be shed on human somatic growth, both optimal (and the meaning of this was debated) and deficient, from animal observations.
