Septrin rated top in major British survey' of urinary pathogen sensitivities

Six clinical bacteriology laboratories – in Glasgow, Liverpool, Hull, Cardiff, Guildford and Salisbury–tested widely used antibacterials against a total of 23,491 urinary isolates (all species). Both out-patient and in-patient strains were included.

The results showed that trimethoprim/sulphamethoxazole (SEPTRIN*) outscored all other


