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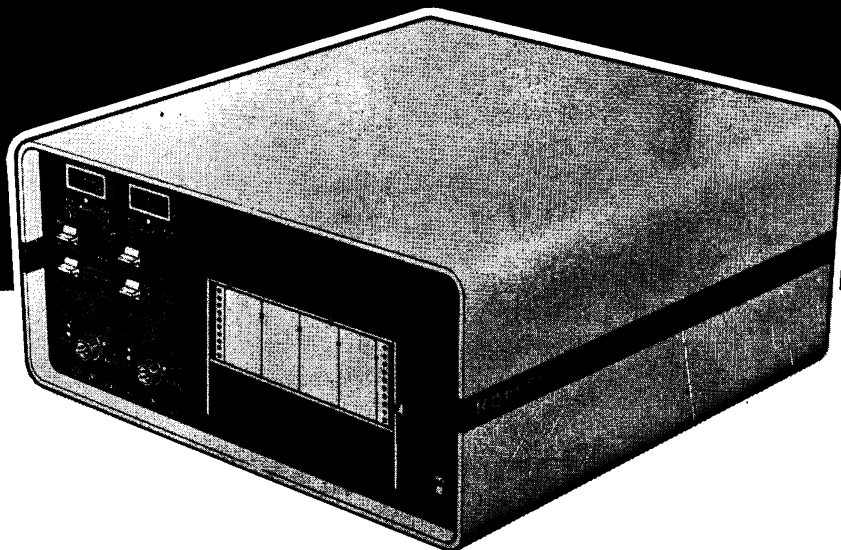

This is a book for the 'white coat pocket' and will prove to be invaluable as a concise and quickly-accessible source of reference.

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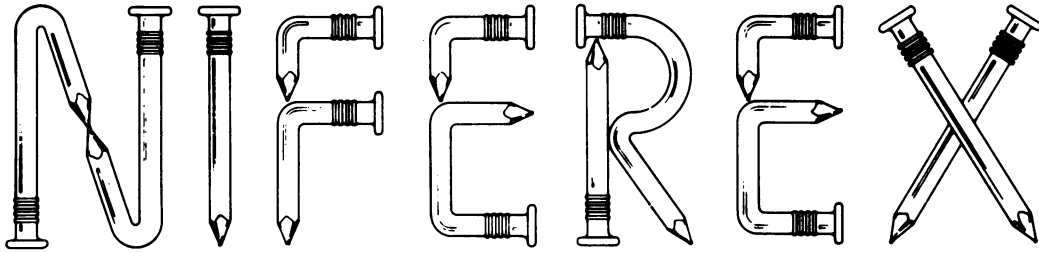
