Notice to Contributors

Papers for publication should be sent to the Editors, *Archives of Disease in Childhood*, BMA House, Tavistock Square, London WC1H 9JR. Submission of a paper will be held to imply that it contains original work not offered elsewhere or previously published. Permission to republish must be obtained from the Editors and the publishers.

For guidance on ethical aspects please refer to the Editorial in this Journal (1978; 53: 441-2).

Manuscripts prepared in the Vancouver style (*Br Med J* 1982; 284: 1766-70) are acceptable.

Authors should check the following requirements before submitting 2 copies of the paper:

- (1) Scripts should be typed in double spacing.
- (2) SI units are preferred. If old fashioned units are used SI units should appear after in parentheses or, for Tables and Figures, a conversion factor given as a footnote.
- (3) Title should be as brief as possible and should not contain the words 'child', 'children', or 'childhood' (already implicit in the title of the Journal).
- (4) The number of authors should be kept to the minimum and initials and family names used.
- (5) Institution(s) where work was done to be stated.
- (6) Summary should be typed on a separate sheet saying briefly what was done and what was concluded.
- (7) Acknowledgements should be limited to workers whose courtesy or assistance has extended beyond their paid work, and supporting organisations.
- (8) Name and address of author supplying reprints to be given at end of paper, or 'No reprints available'.
- (9) Figures should be numbered, referred to in the text, and provided with captions typed on a separate sheet. (a) *Diagrams*: use thick, white paper and insert lettering lightly in pencil. (b) *Photographs (black and white)*: on glossy paper, unmounted, and trimmed to include only the relevant section. All lettering, etc., should be shown on a separate transparent sheet.
- (10) Tables should be numbered, have titles, and be typed on separate sheets. Please avoid large tables.
- (11) References in the text should be numbered consecutively the first time they are cited. The list should be in the order in which the references are first mentioned. (a) *For papers*: give names of all authors, full title of paper, journal name, year of publication, volume number, first and last page numbers. Abbreviate titles of journals in accordance with the list in the *Index Medicus* (January issue or Part 2 of the cumulated volumes). (b) *For books*: give names of all authors, full title of chapter, names of all editors, full title of book, volume and/or edition number, first and last page numbers, publisher's name and address, year of publication.

Short reports. Short papers, brief laboratory observations, and preliminary communications should be submitted for this section. Single case reports will usually only be considered in this form. Length must not exceed two printed pages of text. In general this will be less than 900 words, including a summary of less than 50 words, one or two small Tables or Figures, and up to six references. A report of a negative-result trial, based on a reasonable hypothesis, is more likely to gain acceptance if it is submitted as a *very short report* of half that length.

Proofs. One page proof will be sent to the submitting author.

Reprints. Twenty-five reprints are supplied free and further reprints may be ordered when the proof is returned.

FELLOWSHIPS OF THE
BRITISH PAEDIATRIC
ASSOCIATION**

H. J. Heinz Company Limited generously endows Fellowships in Paediatrics which are administered by the British Paediatric Association.

Two or three Fellowships will be offered each year, the number and type awarded in any one year depending on circumstances and the calibre of applicants available.

The types of Fellowship, which are open to men or women are:

- A To enable a paediatrician from any part of the Commonwealth overseas to spend up to twelve weeks in the United Kingdom, meeting British paediatricians and seeing something of their work. Preference will be given to those recently established in an academic career who can arrange their visit to allow attendance at the Annual Meeting of the British Paediatric Association in April 1985.
- B *Discontinued.*
- C To enable a paediatrician from the United Kingdom of Senior Registrar or Consultant status, but in the early years of professional life, to make a short working visit (up to three months) to a centre in a developing country, teaching or conducting research so as to benefit both fellow and hosts.

Applications for these awards must be received by the British Paediatric Association not later than 31st December 1983.

Applications for C Fellowships can be accepted up to 31st January 1984.
